

A MESSAGE FROM THE COUNSELORS AND SOCIAL WORKER

Respect for all Week will launch on Feb 5th and continue from February 8th to February 1lth. This year our conversation is about Respect, Acceptance and Diversity.

The RFA program was launched in 2007 to build the capacity of staff and students to actively promote a community of inclusion in each of our schools.

The importance of promoting respect for diversity in our daily practice is vital to creating and sustaining an inclusive school climate and culture in each of our schools so that all students feel valued, supported and safe.

In grades K-4, we will build on the lessons of the past months on bullying awareness, kindness and respect, diversity and acceptance. In grades K-2, lessons will focus on learning to speak out, work together and be an ally. In grades 3-4 students will focus on learning to be an upstander in challenging situations. In grades 5-8 we will focus on our students' digital citizenship. The students will learn about their digital footprint and how their actions are reflected online.

Black History Month

Students in grades K-8 will also be observing Black History Month. Each day students will learn about a different figure in Black History. Sonita is sharing an interactive calendar that families can use for discussion at home.

In the Lower Division, we will continue the conversation in Morning Meetings and classroom SEL with discussions and read-alouds that reflect on family, culture, community and achievements in African-American life. Upper Division Advisory lessons will focus on learning about Black History.

Lunar New Year

Students will also be learning about Lunar New Year via classroom activities in the coming weeks. Check your teacher newsletter to learn more.
